











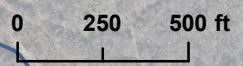
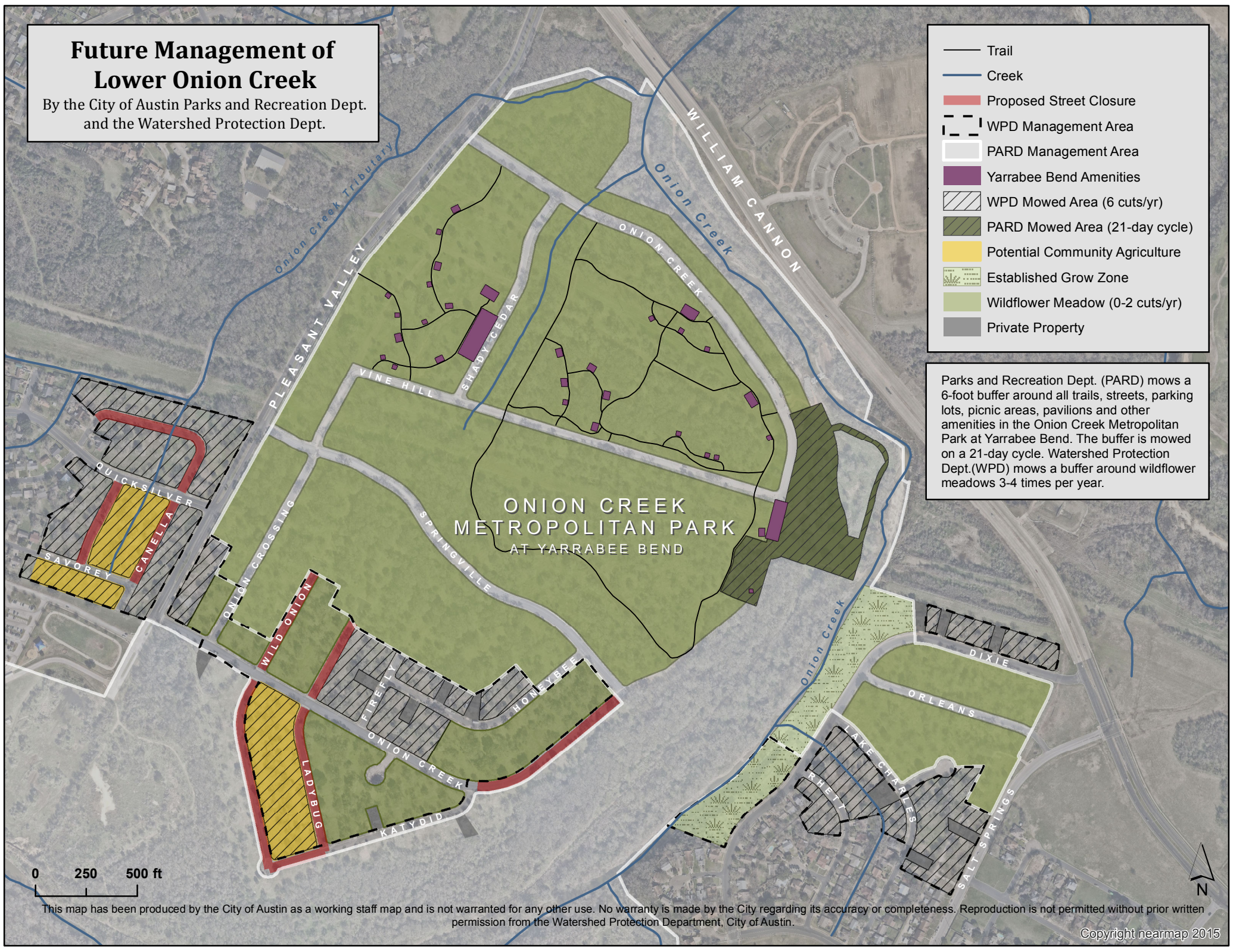


Future Management of Lower Onion Creek

Parks and Recreation Dept. (PARD) mows a 6-foot buffer around all trails, streets, parking lots, picnic areas, pavilions and other amenities in the Onion Creek Metropolitan Park at Yarrabee Bend. The buffer is mowed on a 21-day cycle. Watershed Protection Dept. (WPD) mows a buffer around wildflower meadows 3-4 times per year.



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
